FROM THE PUBLIC COMMENT GUIDANCE: IN BRIEF

- The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) is proposing a redesign of NHIS for 2028.
- Some disability and functioning questions would be removed.
- The way households are asked to respond would also change.
- The redesign is not final, and NCHS is asking for public comment.
- This guide highlights what matters for disability data and helps you prepare a specific comment to make your voice count.

Accessibility note: This document is organized with Word headings so screen reader users can move by section. The first pages provide a summary; the detailed crosswalk tables follow. In the tables, status information is written in text, such as **RETAINED**, **NOT RETAINED**, or **CHANGED**, and is not conveyed by color alone. Survey variable names and placeholders, such as **WG-SS**, **WG-ES**, and bracketed source text, are included because they come from NHIS source materials. Readers who want the plain-language overview may start with “At a glance” before reviewing the detailed tables.

About this crosswalk

Purpose. This streamlined crosswalk is designed to be used with the **NHIS 2028 proposed changes Public Comment Guidance (Focus on Disability)**. It centers the 49 adult disability, functioning, support-use, pain, fatigue, social-participation, and work-limitation items. This crosswalk includes a concise set of chronic-condition items that are especially relevant to disability analyses. It preserves exact question text where the source provides it and shows whether corresponding content is included in the proposed 2028 adult questionnaire.

At a glance

- The proposed 2028 adult questionnaire retains questions about six domains: seeing, hearing, walking/climbing steps, remembering/concentrating, self-care, and communication. These align with the Washington Group Short Set (WG-SS)
- Many more detailed functioning and support-use questions are not included, including mobility equipment and assistance, detailed walking measures, upper-body function, detailed cognition, and fatigue.
- The three items highlighted in the public-comment guidance for developmental disability identification—learning, receipt of help with everyday tasks, and age of disability onset before age 22—are not included in the proposed 2028 adult questionnaire.
- General pain questions are included in the proposed 2028 questionnaire. The current Washington Group anxiety/depression functional questions are not retained as a set; the redesign uses different clinical screening questions, while medication items are retained with changes.

Reading the detailed table below: RETAINED means a corresponding item is included in the proposed 2028 draft; NOT RETAINED means it is not included; MODIFIED/CHANGED means related content remains but wording or structure changes. WG-SS = Washington Group Short Set; WG-ES = Washington Group Extended Set.

Fielding note. The earlier crosswalk identifies these chronic-condition items as 2026 Annual Core or Sponsored Content but does not establish a complete historical year range for each item. This version does not infer years that are not documented in the supplied sources.

† Learning (SOCLEARN_A) and receipt of help (SOCTASKS_A) were first fielded in 2026. The public-comment guidance notes that they are scheduled to remain in NHIS in 2027, but they are not included in the proposed 2028 questionnaire.

* The functioning-content spreadsheet does not provide a data-collection year for PAIWKLM3M_A. This crosswalk leaves that field explicit rather than inferring a year.

Scope note. This remains a focused public-comment companion, not a complete inventory of every health condition, treatment, injury, or outcome question in NHIS. The chronic-condition section restores information most directly useful for identifying condition-based populations or understanding disability-related health experiences.

Focused questions that can be used in a public comment

- For each disability or functioning item proposed for removal, what evidence and criteria were used, and did paper-questionnaire or skip-logic constraints affect the decision?
- How will the proposed question set support analyses that currently use fuller Washington Group functioning measures beyond the Short Set?

Data use and continuity

- Which current NCHS, CDC, or other federal analyses rely on the functioning and disability items proposed for removal, and which of those analyses would no longer be possible or comparable after 2028?
- How will NCHS protect the ability to pool multiple years of data and compare trends for smaller disability populations?

- Why implement the redesign before a third year of the 2026 ACL-sponsored learning and receipt-of-help questions is available? Would NCHS consider phased implementation or delay if more time is needed?

Methods and representation

- How will NCHS test whether self-administered response changes participation or data quality for people with intellectual, cognitive, communication, sensory, physical, or mental health disabilities?
- How will NCHS measure and report differences in response, proxy use, missing data, or survey completion by disability and response mode?
- Will NCHS conduct and publish a bridge or pilot analysis showing how the new response mode affects response rates, proxy use, missing data, disability estimates, and accessibility for people who use assistance or assistive technology?

Review process

- How does the review and testing process for the 2028 redesign compare with the process used for the 2019 redesign, including multiple rounds of public input, expert panels, field testing, and a bridge sample?
- Will NCHS publish the findings from cognitive, usability, and field testing and provide an opportunity to comment on substantial revisions before the 2028 questionnaire is finalized?
