Overview

Purpose of the Asset Map

Asset Mapping is the process of taking a "snapshot" of a system and its stakeholders at a point in time. North Dakota's Asset Map is a working document, used as a tool to:

- Document Existing Stakeholder Engagement Assets: Target Groups and Initiatives
- Encourage Systematic and Strategic Thinking About Next Steps, Ultimately Saving Time and Resources
- Reference When Brainstorming Potential Target Groups to Engage
- Expand and Improve on Current Systems and Processes Within the North Dakota Department of Human Services (ND DHS)

Stakeholder engagement, including service users, is a critical component of person-centered thinking, planning, and practice because it can connect and support allies that are conducting similar engagement activities; build mutual respect and trust among groups; improve decision-making processes; and enhance statewide strategies, program designs, and implementation techniques.



Development Process

As part of the National Center on Advancing Person-Centered Practices and Systems (NCAPPS) Technical Assistance (TA) received by ND DHS, a cross-division workgroup representing eight divisions — Behavioral Health, Adults and Aging Services, Children and Family Services, Developmental Disabilities, Vocational Rehabilitation, Medical Services (Medicaid Office), Administration and Field Services — is facilitating the development of the statewide plan, ensuring that person-centered practices are consistent and fully implemented across all DHS divisions to establish a system-wide culture for person-centered practices. Program Administrators within each division will be engaged and responsible for executing a self-assessment, conducting training, and implementing person-centered policies and procedures. A subset of workgroup participants met with subjective matter experts, Collective Insight and HSRI, to brainstorm target groups and initiatives and establish the draft.

Process

The Asset Map is a working document and this tool will be reviewed and updated as each division participates in the initial self-assessment process and during the ongoing re-evaluation. To this end, during NCAPPS TA, the Project Manager will maintain the document.

Scope of the North Dakota Asset Map

The People We Are Aiming to Serve

Our goal is to develop and execute a statewide plan to enhance overall commitment to person-centered practice for all disability populations served by the ND DHS and its multiple service partners. We also are interested in engagement strategies that encourage collaboration among Executive Leadership, Senior Leadership, and division staff within ND DHS. As a tool to connect stakeholders and promote engagement, the Asset Map should only include current groups and initiatives; reports should not be older than five years.

Target Group	Definition		
Advocates	Individuals/organizations that have direct experience with Services Users and/or Family Members/Informal Supports and assume a paid or unpaid role in systems change. May or may not be a person with lived experience accessing services.		
Administration Services: ND DHS Leadership	Leadership for the ND Department of Human Services, including the Executive Director, Executive Leadership, and Senior Leadership who oversee the program management, clinical staff, direct service workers, and agency partners.		
Adults and Aging Services Division	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that administers programs and services that help older adults and people with physical disabilities or a brain injury to live safely and productively in the least restrictive, appropriate setting.		

Associations	Groups of people organized for a joint purpose.		
Behavioral Health Division	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that provides leadership for the planning, development, and oversight of a system of care for children, adults, and families affected by severe emotional disorders, adults with a brain injury, adults and children with mental illness, and/or substance abuse issues.		
Children and Family Services Division	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that Responsible to programs and services, as well as policies and procedures, for public child welfare services.		
Coalitions, Committees, Councils and Workgroups	Structured coalitions, committees, councils and workgroups that are actively engaged with the disability populations served by the ND Department of Human Services.		
Developmental Disabilities	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that provides support and training to individuals and families to maximize community and family inclusion, independence, and self-sufficiency; to prevent institutionalization; and to enable institutionalized individuals to return to the community.		
Family Members/Informal Supports	Unpaid caregivers who support friends, family, and/or loved ones who are accessing services.		
Field Services	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that is responsible for directly providing behavioral health services through the Life Skills and Transition Center, Regional Human Service Centers, the State Hospital, and Vocational Rehabilitation Offices.		
General Public	Citizens of North Dakota who have no special role in a particular area pertaining to ND DHS.		
Alternative Decision Makers/Guardians	An individual or entity under a legal obligation to care for and make decisions on behalf of the Service User. Scope from law – someone under the law a legal obligation to support the person with decision making for recognized court order. ND Guardian Establishment Program		

Medical Services (Medicaid Office)	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that is responsible for the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Children's Special Health Services (CSHS), Health Tracks, and Medicaid.		
Providers	Entity-provided formal support through a contractual agreement/obligation.		
Self-Advocates	Individuals who have functional limitations due to a disability, who are eligible for Medicaid waivers, and who support and/or advocate for others with similar experiences. May or may not be individuals paid for this role or have formal training. May or not be individuals who access waiver services.		
Service Users	Individuals accessing and/or waiting to access services provided by the ND Department of Human Services.		
Supported Decision Makers	An individual that has signed a <u>supported decision making agreement</u> on behalf of a Service User, agreeing to support the Service User in making well-informed, voluntary decisions.		
Vocational Rehabilitation	Division of the ND Department of Human Services that assists individuals in accessing services and supports to promote quality of life, independence, and employment.





Projects	Summary		
ALL Group	A self-advocacy group, funded by the State Council for Developmental Disabilities that ensures that people with disabilities are treated as equal and given the same decisions, choices, rights, responsibilities, and chance to speak up and empower themselves to live, learn, create, and work.		
Consumer Family Network	Funded by a grant through Children and Family Services, the group is peer- run with representation around the state.		
ND State Council on Developmental <u>Disabilities</u>	A peer setting that addresses issues for all disabilities.		
Legislative Working Committees	Facilitated by North Dakota Protection & Advocacy Project, these committees serve to educate people with disabilities, family members, and advocates about the Legislative process, disability-related Legislation, and the protocol for communicating with State Senators and Representatives.		
Legislative Training Institute	Immersive learning experience for children to learn the basic ideals and principles of State government.		
Mental Health Advocacy Network	A coalition for advocating for consumer-driven mental health services, calling for immediate solutions to gaps in services. Advocates for direct involvement of consumers and families, veterans and those from rural communities in shaping prevention, intervention, service planning, and delivery.		
Person-Centered Practices System Change	Statewide plan, supported by NCAPPS TA, to establish a systemwide culture for person-centered policy, training and practices.		
Youth Empowering Social Status (YESS)	A peer setting that addresses issues for all disabilities.
